Course Requirements

Students are required to write a note (three to four pages long, double spaced and typewritten) on a substantial amount of the required readings for any week of their choice, due the Friday after these readings are discussed in class; participate actively in class discussion; make two presentations - one on some of the required readings for a week of their choice, and another regarding their term papers; respond to another student's presentation on some readings; and write a 20- to 25-page research paper. All written assignments should be submitted in word format, doubled-spaced, on 12-point Times Roman font with 1" margins. Two students will share the presentations on the readings on most weeks when readings are discussed. The presentations on the readings should each be about 20 minutes long, and the responses to another student'
